The ESFRI Roadmap

The ESFRI Roadmap identifies, follows-up and stimulates the implementation of new pan-European Research Infrastructures, or major upgrades to existing ones, corresponding to the needs of European research communities in the next 10 to 20 years, in all fields of research.

ESFRI reports to the Competitiveness Council and ERAC, and its output can be taken up by Horizon 2020 and by national governments, who can fund the implementation of prioritized Research Infrastructures.

- The first ESFRI Roadmap was published in 2006. Updated in 2008, 2010 and 2016 (current version).
- Next updates programmed for **2018, 2020**.
- Current roadmap lists 21 Active Projects and 29 Landmarks.
- Landscape analysis identifies existing Research Infrastructures, gaps and opportunities for their development within the European Research Area and for global coordination.

The Road mapping also comprises the monitoring of Projects and periodic review of Landmarks
